### RAF 2010 is now open for applications

Applications are now being accepted for the Regional Arts Fund, one of the key funding sources for arts and cultural activities in regional, rural and remote communities of NSW. The Regional Arts Fund (RAF) supports arts and cultural activities that have long term cultural, economic and social benefits, promote partnerships and cultural networks, and provide skills development opportunities. In NSW, the RAF is administered by Regional Arts NSW. Funding is available for projects commencing after 1 January 2010 in the categories of New Initiatives, Partnerships and Residencies and Mentorships. Funding is available for one, two or three year projects. "The value of this fund for arts and cultural development in regional NSW cannot be overstated," said Elizabeth Rogers, CEO of Regional Arts NSW. "In 2009 a total of amount \$326,200 was approved for a wide range of projects that included theatre projects, visual arts, multi-media, dance, music and film."
