GOULBURN LIEDER THEATRE MEDIA RELEASE



The Goulburn Lieder Theatre Company is set to represent Goulburn, and indeed Australia, for the very first time at the Mondial International Theatre Festival in the Principality of Monaco and at the FITAG International Theatre Festival in Girona, Spain in August 2009.

Twelve representatives from the Lieder Theatre, including 4 young people aged between 14 – 23 have been offered this opportunity of a lifetime; performing an original locally devised work entitled, 'The Colour Play' which will be seen in Monaco by representatives from over 24 countries. The participants will be attending skill development workshops with professional theatre practitioners from Russia, Lithuania and the U.S.A and will be attending a forum for discussion that will include the history of the Goulburn Lieder Theatre, our aims as a theatre company, the life of our organisation and group and the cultural context of our region and our country.

'The Colour Play,' which is currently in rehearsal and will premier in Goulburn prior to leaving for Monaco & Spain on 14th August 09, transcends the boundaries of language by using a non-verbal 'comedia' form of theatre to highlight the universal themes of tolerance and conflict within culturally diverse rural communities.

RAF 2010 is now open for applications

Applications are now being accepted for the Regional Arts Fund, one of the key funding sources for arts and cultural activities in regional, rural and remote communities of NSW. The Regional Arts Fund (RAF) supports arts and cultural activities that have long term cultural, economic and social benefits, promote partnerships and cultural networks, and provide skills development opportunities. In NSW, the RAF is administered by Regional Arts NSW. Funding is available for projects commencing after 1 January 2010 in the categories of New Initiatives, Partnerships and Residencies and Mentorships. Funding is available for one, two or three year projects. "The value of this fund for arts and cultural development in regional NSW cannot be overstated," said Elizabeth Rogers, CEO of Regional Arts NSW. "In 2009 a total of amount \$326,200 was approved for a wide range of projects that included theatre projects, visual arts, multi-media, dance, music and film."

Federal Budget announces \$62.3 million for arts and culture

The Rudd Government has delivered on its commitments and strengthened its support for Australia's arts and cultural sector with an investment of \$62.3 million in the 2009-10 Federal Budget. Arts Minister Peter Garrett has announced new programs to support artists, increase access and promotion of the arts, and maintain support for existing programs. "This budget recognises the critical role the arts play in nourishing our community and supporting employment particularly during difficult economic times," Mr Garrett said. "The Government has delivered on a number of election commitments in this budget, including boosting support for Australia's Indigenous artists - a key source of Indigenous employment - and developing opportunities for young and emerging artists to build sustainable careers."
